In early 2009, a delegation of Tuia te Matangi representatives (Aunty Nancy, Whaea Dayveen, Whaea Janis, our daughter, 'KaariamaiPāpa, myself and Koro Tahi Takao) attended the National Te Rūnanganui o Ngā Kura Kaupapa Māori ki Aotearoa, Hui-ā-Tau, being held at TKKM o Mangere, in Tamaki Makaurau.

The purpose of our attendance was to present a formal tono, for Tuia te Matangi to establish under the kaupapa of Te Aho Matua. Aunty Nancy, also lovingly referred to as Nanny Te Mamae, spoke that day with strength and humility to a well-attended room of mātanga, on why we needed a kura kaupapa Māori in our rohe, and the benefits to our local people, and to all in Aotearoa!

Nanny Te Mamae's efforts and commitment will be felt and known through our kura for years to come. Her own personal sacrifices for the preservation and revitalisation to te reo Māori me ōnā tikanga resonated through the duration of her tangi, and I am grateful to have been in attendance with so many others, to farewell her on Taupiri maunga. We acknowedge her daughter, Whaea Dayveen, who too, so like her mother, has, and continues, to give so much to Tuia te Matangi, and the building and upliftment of te reo Māori me ōnā tikanga here in Te Tauihu o te Waka a Māui. Kia tau te aroha me te rangimārie i runga i a koutou, te whānau Stephens, Akuhata, and Ahu.

During Whaea Lara's appointment as tumuaki, Pāpā Pele Fa'auli, who had a long history with the establishment of TKKM o Kaikohe in the Nōta, was brought on board to assist in a cultural advisory capacity. Pāpā Pele gave of his knowledge and experiences to assist the development and progression of Tuia te Matangi. Before moving to Te Tauihu o te waka a Māui, Pāpā Pele served on the Ngāpuhi Iwi trust board, and was instrumental in setting up educational strategies for his people and their generations to come. He was also an ambassador for Tū Pono, *Te Mana Kaha o te Whānau!* The empowerment of the whānau given back to the whānau! Pāpā Pele will be greatly missed in our hāpori, as a man of God, of great faith, a beloved husband, father, and grandfather, and stallwart for the revitalisation of Reo Māori me ōnā tikanga.

DRIVEWAY & PARKING


R.E.P.E.A.T

As previously stated, we are off the starting blocks with our kapa haka. Our goal is to make a strong stand at the upcoming Te Huinga Whetū, qualifyer for Te Mana Kuratahi 2021! Māmā Wirihana and I have been discussing noho Marae, and will send a pānui out once we have everything in place, or how we may need your support and assistance. What can whanau do now?

- If you have girls, please make sure they have a set of poi, and are training right now, not, waiting for the competition poi to be taught.
- We will be relying heavily on our junior numbers this campaign, as the majority are Kaiahipua, with the Māmā's. If your tamaiti is in Kaiahipua, please give some thought to how you and your whānau may assist them to learn the material, raise their confidence about performing in front of audiences, and so forth. We will definately have our older teina Yr5-Yr8 setting the strong presence in the rows, but we are very aware of some anxieties the intensity of kapa haka can bring.
- Is there going to be a repeat of last year? Firstly, while I've been asked this, I don't really know the specifics of whanau concerns as there were very few raised with me. I can say without a doubt, that the kapa haka program is very important to Tuia te Matangi. The way in which pouako, ākonga, and whānau are expected to interact in such kaupapa, is very clear and specific. It is a new year, we are creating opportunities, and expectations are held by the akonga and tutors alike.
- Whānau can help by TALKING IT UP, and giving our tamariki only the best feel-good vibes! When the tamariki feel positively supported, they will try their very best to accomplish and smash goals - we hope kapa haka will be the same!

Lastly, any campaign is best run when everyone is on board, supporting those in place who tutor, and who perform. We look forward to this support as our ākonga train hard to represent not just TKKM o Tuia te Matangi, but Iwi, Hapū & Whānau also!

Noho Marae this weekend, 13-14 March Whakatū Marae

Everything will kick off with Powhiri ar 6pm Friday evening, followed by a parent hui after kai. The rangatahi will go straight into wānanga during this time. The hui is an opportunity to raise any questions you may have or details you need for your whānau involvement and preparations.

The TRK committee have confirmed that the noho wananga following at the end of March, will be the last chance for kaihaka to join, so if we have akonga still sitting on the fence about joining, don't leave it too late to decide.
